Introduction

Whether you live in urban, rural or regional Australia, you too can lessen your impact on the global environment by adopting sustainable living practices at home, at work and at school.

For example, there are other "R" words beyond Reduce, Reuse, Recycle that people could use in regards to how they manage their buying, consumption (i.e., use of) and disposal of unwanted goods. *Refuse* the offer of a free plastic carry bag; or buy "2 for one" or "2nd item half price" when appropriate.

Facts for thought and further action:

Australia (ABS statistics) generated 75.8 million tonnes of solid waste in 2018-19, which was a 10% increase over the last two years (since 2016-17). Over half of all waste was sent for recycling (38.5 million tonnes), while 27% was sent to landfill for disposal (20.5 million tonnes). Households generated 12.4 million tonnes (16.3%).



The Waste Hierarchy

Most Preferable



Priority of Actions

Avoid — collecting or creating waste

Reduce — waste and use of resources, especially water and electricity

Reuse — what you can

Repurpose — use discarded product or its arts in a new product with a different function.

Repair — give an item a longer life

Downsize — send items to welfare stores, not to the tip; donate to special appeals – major (and minor)

Divert — food waste to worm farms or compost

- tree prunings and lawn clippings to mulch
- excess food to Food Bank

Recycle — see *Recycling Near You* services

- glass, paper, plastic, steel, aluminium
- support your Council's recycling programs

Reprocess — most discarded products

• see industry initiatives

Disposal — to the appropriate facility – don't litter or illegally dump
